CPC's 2023-2025 STRATEGIC PLAN

CPC collaborates with local, state, and national partners to improve and expand early childhood education (ECE) programs based on current data. Data include local family and child information gathered from surveys, interviews, focus groups, and other local assessments, forming the basis for CPC's 2023-2025 Strategic Plan goals, objectives, and action plans.

During the FY 2023-2024, CPC's Coalition coordinated community resources to support various ECE initiatives in Grant County:

- **Negotiated and secured transportation** from the Montoya Bussing for the KSSAP Partnership.
- **Improved the childcare landscape by uniting childcare leaders** in Grant County to effectively collaborate.
- **Provided guidance and support** for 6+ current and potential home-based childcare providers.
- **Distributed resources and enhanced the knowledge and understanding of early childhood development** for 10+ caregivers in Grant County.
- **Utilized a web-based approach to create outreach opportunities for 5000+ families** to access local ECE resources and services.
- **Impacted high quality services to 1500+ young children** through Grant County ECE programs.
- **Engaged stakeholders in 60+ facilitated sessions to better align ECE services** with hundreds of families and the community.
